

Academics



- Free full-day kindergarten program is available to all students.
- Integrated preschool is available to students with special needs and to typically developing peers.
- 9 Advanced Placement courses offered to high school students.
- Through Virtual High School and Edgenuity, students have access to over 200 additional courses, including additional AP, science, business and foreign language courses.
- Hull High School is fully NEASC accredited.
- Music, art, technology, health and physical education programs are offered in grades K-12.

Technology

- All students in grades K-12 are issued either an iPad or a Chromebook. Coding is taught to all students starting in Kindergarten.
- High-speed wireless internet access is available in all schools, as well as a state-of-the-art foreign language lab at the high school. Most classrooms are equipped with interactive whiteboards.
- Technology education programs in grades 6-8 focus on the Engineering Design Process, where students design and build projects.
- Music and video production courses are offered. The school district partners with Hull Community TV to produce programs on local cable television.
- Hull High School offers a fully operational woodshop and a new partnership with the Hull Lifesaving Museum.
- Galileo Benchmark Assessment System grades 1-9 for a deep understanding of student achievement and growth.
- Moving Curriculum Maps to central platform, CHALK, to align curriculum to MA State Standards.
