FY20 School Budget

Superintendent Judy Kuehn and Business Manager, David DeGennaro, presented the FY21 school budget. The presentation included the following:

- Meeting the Needs of All Students
- FY21 Budget Priorities
- Military and College Acceptances (2015-2019)

- FY20 Budget Proposal Comparison
- Sources of Funds
- Historical Grant Funding

Ms. Kuehn reiterated that the FY21 budget shows a 1.36% increase over the FY20 Administration budget. This percent is the Town Manager's recommendation and will be presented at Town Meeting. Ms. Kuehn and Mr. DeGennaro answered questions from Advisory Board members.

#### Warrant Articles

Town Manager, Philip Lemnios, discussed two warrants that will be presented at Town Meeting. Article 12a (project funding without MSBA assistance) to see if the Town will appropriate \$1,600,000 to pay costs of renovating and making repairs to the exterior of Memorial Middle School. Mr. Lemnios said this warrant is the way he would like to see happen because it will mean a faster start and end time to the project and also, the building could be used for any purpose, not just a school. Article 12b would have the Town doing the Repair Project Feasibility Study through MSBA for \$400,000 and not sure when the project would start or be completed and would need to remain a school until paid off.

School Committee and Advisory Board asked Mr. Lemnios questions regarding both scenarios.
