7.0 Superintendents Business Items

7.1 School Safety Protocols

Police Chief Dunn discussed school safety and how the police and schools work closely together to keep our schools safe. He said there is constant training going on and the police are checking doors and buildings regularly. He said he is having police officers who are on duty but doing paperwork in their vehicles to park close to or on school property so they will be visible. Current School Resource Officer Marshalsea discussed ALICE training and lockdown procedures that has been ongoing with school personnel and students at the high school level. Officer DelVecchio introduced himself as incoming SRO beginning FY23 school year. Committee members asked questions.

7.2 HHS Out-of-State Field Trip

Mr. Ian Barkon, Hull High School music teacher, asked permission to take a group of students to New York City next year to perform at the New York Heritage Festival and to see the sights in the city. He said he is bringing this forth now to hopefully entice more students to take music classes and build up the numbers in the band.

7.3 Curriculum and Assessment Update

Dr. Mary Merrigan said the middle school has been piloting a grade 6-8 social studies curriculum. She said that teachers from other content areas were picking up a section of social studies and next year we will have dedicated social studies teachers. She introduced Mr. Mark MacDonald and Ms. Laurie Vaughen, who currently are long-term substitute teachers but who will be two new social studies teachers next year. Mr. MacDonald and Ms. Vaughen presented the McGraw Hill curriculum they have been piloting. Dr. Merrigan recommended implementing this curriculum.
