## 7.2 INTERFACE

Ms. Kuehn stated that she has been on the waiting list for 8 years and has finally been able to secure a grant for the INTERFACE Referral Service program, which is open 5 days a week from 9:00 to 5:00 for all residents of Hull securing mental health services. Any Hull resident will have access to the hotline. The interface group work with insurance companies to help residents who need it. She said it will take down barriers. It has already been passed along and got some responses.

## 7.3 NEASC at Hull High School

Mr. Michael Knybel, Hull High School Principal, discussed the upcoming NEASC visit, which will take place Sunday, March 5 to Wednesday, March 8 at Hull High School. He said that NEASC has evolved to be more vision and mission driven. The said that they will start on Sunday with virtual meetings and may ask a couple of School Committee members, as well as parents, to be interviewed. He went on to explain what they will be looking for in the process.

## 7.4 Phase I Update

Ms. Kuehn reiterated what was voted on at the last meeting and updated the Committee and community on what has been going on in regards to phase I of the consolidation process. She said there is a Google Doc with action items on it and who will be completing those actions. She said there is a Brewing Conversations scheduled for the early release for parent/teacher conferences on March 13 with phase I as the topic. Committee members asked questions and made comments. Ms. Peters asked that a tally of budget spent be kept to get a clear picture of how much it costs to do this project.
