7.1 Comfort Dog – Peddocks

Director of Student Services Kristen Ryan introduced Peddocks and his handler, Hull Police Officer Leanne Marshalsea, to the school committee. Ms. Ryan stated Peddocks joined us over the summer and made a few visits at different events. He will be starting at the high school, and appointments with him may be made through the student services office. Officer Marshalsea said Peddocks is a purebred Labrador Retriever, who joined the Hull Police Department last spring as a comfort dog to support students and others in the community by helping to reduce stress and promote wellness in the schools and at town events. HPD acquired Peddocks, who is named after the Boston Harbor Island, with assistance from a \$5,000 grant from the Plymouth County District Attorney's Office. The first comfort dog to serve the Hull Police, 11-month-old Peddocks underwent his comfort dog training at Professional Canine Services in Middleboro and has already gotten down to business. Officer Marshalsea explained that Peddocks is also trained in search-and-rescue, such as helping to find lost children and adults.
