- 1.0 Call to Order The meeting was called to order by Eric Hipp at 7:03 p.m. at Hull High School Exhibition Room, 180 Main Street with the salute to the flag.

Mr. Timothy Mackenzie, Hull High School history teacher and member of the HTA (teachers) Union stated that the teachers voted to ratify a one (1) year contract but not a

three (3) year contract. He said that he hopes you (School Committee) will also ratify the one year contract. Mr. Hipp stated that the two sides have been negotiating this contract since October of 2015. The School Committee requested a mediator come in to resolve the contract. He said there have been many sessions this year that lead to an agreement but a single year contract has never been in the offer and this is the first the Committee has heard of a one year contract. The School Committee ratified the four year contract on Friday. He continued by saying he was not in favor or reopening the contract and it is puzzling that the HTA is doing this now. He stated that Mr. Lemnios, Town Manager, said the town will not encumber funds without a ratified contract. When questioned about the HTA ratifying the four year contract on Friday, Ms. McCarthy stated that they did ratify but it was oral, and they came to an agreement in writing when Brendan Sharkey, HTA Representative, looked it over and saw some misunderstandings. Mr. Hipp agreed that there were misunderstandings because in the year and a half of negotiations there was never discussion of a single year deal or of appendix C and D and now it is in the MOA.

7.1 NESDEC Award

Dr. Tyrell presented this year's New England School Development Council (NESDEC) Academic Growth and Student Leadership in Learning Awards to Hull High School Junior, Thomas Nutsongtat. Dr. Tyrell said that Thomas has improved very much since his freshman year. She congratulated Thomas and his family for a job well done.

7.3 School Lunch Program

Mr. David DeGennaro, School Business Administrator, gave an update on the school lunch program. He told the Committee that the Chartwells lunch program has been losing money and he is trying to find ways to increase breakfast and lunch participation. Mr. DeGennaro, Mr. Anthony Hrivnak, Memorial School Principal and Mr. Kyle Shaw, Jacobs School Principal, visited Brockton Public Schools to see how their breakfast program runs to see if it would be a good idea to incorporate the same program in Hull. Brockton also uses Chartwells. Mr. Twombly suggested periodic updates of the program to School Committee. 7.4 AP Government Textbook Adoption

Mr. Michael Devine, Hull High School Principal, recommended adoption of the AP Government textbook *Government in America* by Edwards and Wattenberg. 7.5 FY16 Budget Discussion

Dr. Tyrell gave her recommendation for end of year expenses as discussed at the budget subcommittee meeting, stating that money was tight this year and therefore she put a budget freeze in place early in the school year. She recommended allocating the surplus funds as follows:

- Jacobs School Kiln \$7,970
- MMS Upgrade Computer Lab \$23,053
- JES Sidewalk Repair \$4,000
- District Wide Truck \$34,216

Dr. Tyrell said the truck is used daily for moving equipment, tables and chairs, lawn mowers, waxing machines, along with plowing all three schools.
