7.0 Superintendent's Business Items

7.1 Mathematics Committee Update

Ms. Judith Kuehn, Assistant Superintendent, state that the Superintendent charged the Mathematics Committee to look at the pathways and make sure options could change if necessary. She said the Committee has been meeting since September and they looked at the courses from grade 12 down. The Committee's goal was to be very clear that pathways are a guide for students but they have the opportunity to change the pathways. If a student wants to switch pathways they have to show mastery and give an outline to students and parents letting them know what the student can do to change the placement. Mr. Devine presented the current pathways and what the four new levels will be for students to guide them through the math courses.

Dr. Tyrell updated the Committee on the first meeting of the School Starting Time Committee. She said there are 14 people on the Committee, including herself and Stephanie Peters, the three assistant principals, three parents, three teachers, the athletic director/community outreach coordinator, the business manager and the secretary to the Superintendent. The committee is charged with seeing if there is a viable way to start the high school later in the morning without much disruption and expense. She stated that the Committee will look into the effect on daycare, sports, employment, buses and other issues. At the next meeting on March 23, 2017 Nicole Nosek, Hull High School Assistant Principal, will bring forward the results of other districts that have gone thru this and why it is important to do it. Dr. Tyrell and David DeGennaro, School Business Administrator, will meet and discuss transportation with the bus company and report back. Michael Devine, Hull High School Principal, will report on the effects of a later start without losing the integrity of the last period of the day and James Quatromoni will discuss what will have to happen with afternoon sports.
