6.2 Professional Development Overview

Ms. Judith Kuehn, Assistant Superintendent gave an overview of the 2018-2019 Professional Development. The topics included the following:

12.0 Correspondence to and Comments from School Committee Members

Mr. Patenaude addressed the threat incident at Hull High School on the 19th and thanked the staff and police for handling it swiftly. He also wanted to remind the community that when they are making comments on Facebook they are talking about people's children and these children are probably on social media themselves. He cautioned people to reach out to School Committee personally. People get caught up in conversation and it may be misinformation that gets out to the public.

Ms. Peters said that she followed up on comments made by two community members at the last School Committee meeting that were questioning the use of the HRA land as a place to build a field and community complex. Ms. Peters stated that she spoke to Mr. Bart Kelly, HRA President, who told her that they have an RFP out and expecting bids on October 15th. Another issue is that the homes were taken by eminent domain for profit and not a non-profit organization. Also the land is not wide enough for a field that handles football, soccer and lacrosse. Ms. Peters added that the school department would not be in control of the field and therefore would be charged to use it and may not be able to have a say in game times and days.

Ms. Peters reminded the community of the Realtor Open House which is scheduled for Wednesday, October 3, 2018 at 9:30 am.

Ms. Fleming reiterated what Mr. Patenaude said earlier in the meeting about contacting School Committee members directly and have open dialog rather than listening to commentary that goes on in social media.
