6.1 Hull Community Walking Track and Turf Field Discussion Mr. Hipp mentioned the Conservation Commission will be hearing the proposal on March 22, 2016. The results of the peer review are expected to be available.

Mr. Twombly asked if Gale associates has contacted other places that have a field close to the water. Mr. Hipp replied yes, Gales has been in contact with 3, Gloucester High School, the United States Coast Guard Academy, and Tabor Academy. All are located very close to the water. In addition, Mr. Hipp has supplied them with a list of 20 more sites to look into that appear to have similar situations to Hull's proposal. Mr. Hipp searched for sites on the East Coast that most likely were impacted by Hurricane Sandy.

7.1 Empty Bowls Fundraiser - Ms. Amanda Davis

Students Sarah Ashley and Jessica Batts, along with art teacher Amanda Davis, gave an presented information on the Empty Bowls Fundraiser, which is scheduled to be held on Thursday, March 31, 2016 from 5 p.m. to 7 p.m. at the Hingham Public Library. The fundraiser is being held by The event is sponsored by Whole Foods Market, Hingham Public Library, Old Ship Church and Second Parish Church. 7.3 FY17 Budget Discussion

Dr. Tyrell reported that at this time the FY17 budget is balanced to the Town Manager's recommendation with no layoffs and no reduction in services. The reason the budget is balanced at this point in time is due to several retirements that have been announced and their replacements are anticipated to start at considerably less salary. Mr. Hipp asked about staffing changes in the budget. Overall the budget is up by .9 FTE, which is a .6 library aide paraprofessional and a .3 special educator at the high school. To account for the changing demographics of our student population, two (2) expected classroom teacher open positions will be redeployed as special education teachers.

Hull High School Overview and Budget – Mr. Michael Devine Mr. Michael Devine, Hull High School principal, passed out a handout and gave an overview of how the high school budget is put together and how the money is spent. The handout included:
