A Note from the Principal

The Monday following February vacation our flexible mask policy will begin. With few exceptions, students and staff will be free to choose whether to wear a mask in school. Tomorrow morning, students will watch a video that Mr. Shaw and I created to understand what flexible mask-wearing looks like in our school and the two places where students must still wear masks: in the nurse's office and on the school bus. Throughout the video, we reinforce that it is a personal decision for everyone, and each of us is to support and respect those decisions. We remind students to be kind and not to question, tease, or make judgments if students or teachers choose to wear/not wear a mask. We also tell students that they will continue to use hand sanitizer when they enter and exit the building, before and after lunch, and specialist. We will keep the number of students at each lunch table small and social distance when possible. 




Cold Enough for You?

New and Improved! Health Notes from Ms. Keegan

In accordance with DESE and DPH our district is updating our COVID-19 Testing Program. Beginning February 21 we will be shifting to the new at-home testing option. If you signed up for the program, test kits were sent home in your child's backpack today. Please test your child on each and every Thursday beginning February 24. In addition to this new at-home antigen test option, we will continue with symptomatic testing as needed during the week.

As part of this shift in the program, we will **discontinue Test and Stay and contact tracing for in-school close contacts**. This means that if your child is a potential contact in school, they may continue to come to school and do not have to quarantine. This new at-home testing opportunity is voluntary and <u>only those who opt-in will receive tests</u>.

If you haven't already done so, we strongly encourage you to opt-in RIGHT NOW!

- 2. Symptomatic Testing (If you have not yet signed up, click here)

Individuals should not participate if they have tested positive for COVID -19 within the last 90 days. If you have any questions please contact the school nurse.
