

### Health Notes from Ms. Keegan

## **Tips to Avoid Respiratory Illness**

Massachusetts and much of the US are seeing an increase in respiratory illnesses in children. Everyday prevention measures to help avoid these and other illnesses include:

- ✓ Wash hands often with soap and water especially after coughing/sneezing.
- ✓ Alcohol based hand sanitizers are also effective
- ✓ Cover coughs and sneezes with a tissue, or cough into your elbow.
- ✓ Avoid touching your eyes, nose or mouth
- ✓ Do not share drinks or other items that touch the mouth.
- ✓ Keep your child home if he/she is ill, and/or has a fever of 100 degrees or higher. Temperature should remain normal for 24 hours without medication before the child returns to school.
- ✓ Children should remain home for a full 24 hours after vomiting.
- ✓ Avoid social gatherings if you or your children are ill.
- ✓ Contact your healthcare provider if you believe your child needs medical care.
- ✓ Disinfect frequently touched surfaces, such as doorknobs, tables etc., especially if someone in your household is ill.
- ✓ Adequate fluids and nutritious food during the day, and a good night's sleep each night.
- ✓ Please alert the school if your child has been diagnosed with a contagious disease (COVID, strep, flu etc.)
- ✓ Consider getting a flu vaccine this year. Flu vaccine is still available at the school. Please call the school nurse if you are interested in having your child get the vaccine here at school.
