use such essential tools as the Breathing Tool, the Quiet/Safe Place Tool, the Personal Space Tool, the Garbage Can Tool, and the Patience Tool. The impact of these tools extends beyond the school environment; their use at home is equally crucial for their lasting influence on students' lives. I encourage you to ask your child about their Toolbox Tools, discussing their meanings and how they can be applied in various situations. You may find yourself using the tools, too! We will cover the remaining seven tools during the rest of the school year.

On another note, it's cold out! When the temperature, including windchill, drops below 20 degrees, it is our policy to keep students inside for recess. Most students prefer outdoor recess, of course, and in most cases, when the temperature is above 20 degrees, students will be allowed to play outside (even in the snow) provided they have appropriate clothing (boots, gloves, snowpants).
