A Note from the Principal

We continue to focus on decreasing learning gaps while accelerating learning throughout the year. Simultaneously, we are working to develop strong social-emotional skills for students to succeed in school. As a school community, we work as a team to develop the necessary skills for success. Our occupational therapists are integral in the learning process as we support the whole child through our social-emotional curriculum and Calm Classroom techniques. Occupational therapists focus on academics, play, social participation, self-care skills (Activities of Daily Living, or ADLs), and transition/work skills in schools. Occupational therapy uses meaningful activities to help a child develop the skills they need to learn. Postural strength, fine motor, visual motor, visual perceptual skills, self-regulation, and sensory processing are frequently addressed. Our occupational therapists see children on education plans, but they are also available as consults for all students if an area needs addressing. This year our two occupational therapists, Ms. Bridget Lawson, and Ms. Hartley Flaherty, put together a sensory-motor pathway for students Pre-K through first grade, and motor stations for students in grades two through five. These areas in the hall and offshoots of the hallways are used by all students to help them develop their sensorymotor skills and self-regulate their bodies. Basically, this helps students take a break and refocus their brain on learning. Please see the following slide and videos to learn more and to view our sensory pathway and stations:
