#### A Note from the Principal

This year we are starting something special called **Pirate Time**. It was introduced to students in our assembly on Friday. Pirate Time is 35 minutes, four days a week, where we flood support staff into a grade level during a specific block of time to support instruction and give students "What they need." A student may need more:

- Direct & explicit re-teaching in a small group
- Additional guided practice
- Extended or challenging instruction.

Decisions about each student's needs are based on grade level data that teachers analyze and then plan instruction.

MCAS results were mailed to parents/guardians in fourth and fifth grade. Please contact your child's teacher if you have any questions.

There is a new trend on the social media app TikTok encouraging students to engage in vandalism and other unacceptable behaviors. We are reminding students to be RAD and make good choices that promote a safe learning environment.

It has come to my attention that students are accessing chats while at school and at home using school-issued devices. Communication among students via social media is prohibited in school and interferes with the learning process. In response, classroom teachers will increase education around internet safety as well as school rules regarding devices during Morning Meetings. I ask for your support in having similar conversations with your child in an effort to eliminate these recent trends.

Thank you to all the Book Fair volunteers, and coordinators Laurie Somario and Leah Picewick. Students have enjoyed visiting the Book Fair this week.

Just a reminder there is no school on Monday for the observance of Indigenous People. Enjoy the long weekend!
