A Note from the Principal

I apologize for any misunderstandings regarding Halloween costumes at school on Monday. Prior to the pandemic, our younger students in prek-1 were encouraged to wear costumes during school but, because the costumes often led to disruptions of the learning environment, students in grades 2-5 were not. When the pandemic caused the curtailment of Halloween festivities, we decided to allow all students to wear their costumes to school on the holiday as one of the few ways to celebrate. Now that things are going back to normal, I made the decision to return to our pre-pandemic policy of no inschool costumes for 2nd-5th grade students. Unfortunately I did not make that clear to families and I apologize. Whatever the decision is next year, I will make sure it's known by all. I hope everyone had a great Halloween!

Just a quick note regarding arrival and dismissal: *Whether on the street or at the school, please do not pass a bus that is loading or unloading students.* This has happened on a few rare occasions. Also, if caught behind a bus in the arrival and dismissal lines, it is not necessary to park or pull out of line. Cars will only need to wait until the bus loads or unloads and pulls away.

Ms. Keegan's Health Notes

Massachusetts and much of the US are seeing an increase in respiratory illnesses in children. Everyday prevention measures to help avoid these and other illnesses include:

- Wash hands often with soap and water for 20 seconds
- Cover coughs and sneezes with a tissue, or cough into your elbow.
- Do not share drinks or other items that touch the mouth.
- Keep your child home if he/she is ill, and/or has a fever of 100 degrees or higher. Temperature should remain normal for 24 hours without medication before the child returns to school.
- Children should remain home for a full 24 hours after vomiting.
- Avoid social gatherings if you or your children are ill.
- Contact your healthcare provider if you believe your child needs medical care.
- Disinfect frequently touched surfaces, such as doorknobs, especially if someone in your household is ill.
- Consider getting a flu vaccine this year. Flu vaccine is available at the school. Please call the school nurse if you are interested in having your child get the vaccine here at school.
