A Note from the Principal

At Monday's School Committee meeting I presented the Jacobs School's 2023 MCAS results and outlined our action plan for the future. During the presentation I highlighted our current school accountability percentile, which compares our school's performance with that of other schools in the state. The Department of Elementary and Secondary Education calculates this percentile based on factors such as student achievement and growth, using MCAS assessment results in addition to student attendance. Our accountability percentile currently stands at 53. My goal is to elevate this percentile to 75 by 2025. I know that, together, we can achieve this target, one that truly reflects the excellence of our community.

In pursuit of this objective, I presented several action steps during the School Committee meeting. One of those steps is increasing family engagement. I firmly believe that family engagement is pivotal to every child's success in school. With this in mind, we are committed to meeting with 100% of our families during parent conferences, one week from today. You can sign up for conferences now at [this link](#). Whether it is in-person, via Zoom, or over the phone, your partnership is crucial to improving your child's school experience, as well as our school's overall performance rating.
