This week, we kicked off composting in the cafeteria. Our fifth-grade students have taken on the responsibility of collecting uncooked food scraps at the end of the fourth lunch block, and cycling them into the compost bin located next to the Jacobs Garden. The compost we create will nourish our garden, which in turn will provide produce for school lunches. This sustainable cycle serves as a great lesson for our students and represents a small yet impactful contribution to sustainability.

We're excited to introduce a new JASPER offering, thanks to this year's School Council (not be confused with the student council). A **Homework Club** has been added to our offerings for students in grades 4-6. Students can register for class on Monday, Tuesday, or Thursday, or a combination of days. The Jacobs School's first Turkey Trot was run in 2009 by a couple dozen fifth graders on a Saturday. (Some of those fifth graders, now adults, are currently employed at the Jacobs!) Their entry fee that year was at least 1 canned good, to be donated to Wellspring. That small food drive became a tradition that has evolved over the years into a major school-wide canned food drive, collecting well over 10,000 canned goods! The tradition continues next week with our 14<sup>th</sup> Annual Thanksgiving Food Drive, starting this Monday. Of course awards will be bestowed – all of them to be announced at the Turkey Trot Pep Rally on November 22!
