Test and Stay Program

We are in the process of implementing the *Test and Stay Program* which allows students who have had close contact with a person who tested positive for COVID-19 **while at school** to stay in school if the student is not showing symptoms. Instead of needing to quarantine and miss school, these students will take a daily rapid test at school and will remain in school as long as they are not symptomatic or test positive. Students participate in *Test and Stay* for at least five days after they may have been exposed. If a student tests positive for COVID-19 they must isolate at home for the CDC-recommended ten days since symptoms appeared or ten days since the

isolate at home for the CDC-recommended ten days since symptoms appeared or ten days since the positive test before returning to school. The student must be fever free for 24 hours. As an added precaution, students that test positive with a rapid test will be administered a free PCR test which the District makes available through South Shore Hospital.
