Last Friday, we celebrated the culmination of the 21st Annual Jacobs School Read-a-Thon. The cafeteria buzzed with excitement as students waited to hear the results of their hard work reading and fundraising. This year, we set a goal to raise \$20,000 for the PTO, and the Reading Pirate challenged our students to read 250,000 minutes collectively. If students reached their goals, the Reading Pirate promised to return to unmask the Masked Readers, and to spin the Reading Roulette Wheel to reveal which staff members would participate in a secret stunt! Turns out Jacobs School students didn't just achieve both the fundraising and reading goals, they broke records this year! Incredibly, students raised \$22,433.55 – the highest in Read-a-Thon history – and they also read for more minutes than ever before: 271,615!
