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Box Tops for Education is Another Great Fundraiser for Our School!

HERE'S HOW IT WORKS: Download the free Box Tops app and follow the set-up instructions to start earning \$\$ for the Jacobs School. When you buy participating products, use the Box Tops app to scan your store receipt. The app identifies eligible products and earnings are credited to your designated school. Even if you're shopping online or doing grocery pickup, you can still submit your digital or email receipt with the Box Tops app and earn money for the technology program at the Jacobs School.

Twice a year, the school gets a check! The money goes toward technology at the Jacobs. This year the funds have been used for Picasso Tiles (magnet tiles) and art supplies for STEAM projects. So far this year we have earned \$130.10 from the program. Our lifetime earnings are \$22,044.27!
