Strep Throat Alert from Ms. Keegan

A number of students have been diagnosed with strep throat over the past couple of weeks. Strep throat is very contagious. It is spread easily through sneezing, coughing or shaking hands.

Signs and Symptoms of strep throat:

- sore throat
- fever
- red and swollen tonsils
- painful or swollen neck glands
- red and white patches in the throat
- headache
- stomach pain, nausea
- loss of appetite
- general discomfort
- rash

If your child is complaining of any of the above symptoms I suggest you have them get a strep test at their pediatrician's office. Children diagnosed with strep throat are no longer contagious and can return to school 24 hours after antibiotic treatment has been started.

- 6. Village Playground: 7:55 check-in, 8:00 start time


