Speaking of safety, we are currently in the midst of our annual bus evacuation drills. These drills are a mandatory practice that we conduct each year in partnership with our bus company to ensure the safety of our students.

For the time being, the equipment is in a "look but don't touch" phase. We're carefully reviewing safety guidelines before allowing any use, but we can hardly wait to see students enjoying the playgrounds' fabulous new features!
