However, as we do our best to accelerate the recovery of learning loss, I ask that you assist our efforts by creating and emphasizing routines at home that are conducive to regular and punctual attendance. As I mentioned in last week's Blue Notes, our school's **One Word** for the year is **Together**. We will need to work *together* to improve attendance during the 2022-2023 school year.

We conducted our first **lockdown drill** on Tuesday afternoon in conjunction with the police department. Officer DelVecchio (school resource officer) and old friend Officer Marshalsea (former school resource officer) facilitated the drill as Mrs. Menice and I walked the hallways to make sure all procedures were followed. I was pleased by the work staff had put into preparing for the drill and the students' response. We plan on conducting drills quarterly during the year.


