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#### A Note from the Principal

This month, Jacobs Elementary and Memorial Middle School staff will be trained in a new assessment platform called Galileo. Galileo is a student assessment tool designed to provide our district staff with timely and actionable data about how students perform relative to Massachusetts State Standards. Galileo provides the district with both benchmark assessments for the beginning, middle, and end of the year and a full library of formative assessments for teachers to target our students' areas of need. Teachers will administer benchmark and formative assessments to students in grades 1-8 on Galileo's assessment platform for a midyear evaluation and use the platform throughout the year to understand students' areas of need.

We will use the information from these assessments along with all that is taking place in the classroom to determine what gaps in skills and knowledge need to be taught to finish this academic year strong and have students where they need to be for the next grade-level.

The Commissioner of Education has announced that MCAS testing will take place this spring with shortened testing time for Grades 3-8. Each student in grades 3-8 will take only a portion of each MCAS assessment in ELA, Math, and Science; testing sessions will be reduced by half.
