A Note from the Principal

Last Friday Ms. Pestone introduced our fifth graders to local artist Carolyn Lewenberg, who explained the concept behind the **Starburst Buoy Project**. Students were asked to design and paint buoys with images representing their town and/or staying buoyant in times of adversity. Once complete in mid-December, the fifth-grade buoy starburst will be on display right outside the library until it can be permanently installed in the Hull Art Walk this coming spring.

Fifth-grade students have also been busy conducting oral interviews in social studies. Every year, Mrs. McCarthy has each student **interview a military veteran**. Mrs. McCarthy explains the project, "Students use questions first established for The Veterans History Project as an educational learning opportunity to understand the sacrifices to the country by fellow Americans. The objective is to learn about commitment, leadership and sacrifice, while simultaneously recognizing our responsibility to be our best selves. This year they learned about the various military conflicts, women in the military, family members who were awarded the Purple Heart, awards for excellence and achievement, and most importantly, the selfless commitment by others to protect and defend our democracy. Many students created tri-folds with artifacts, pictures, and memorabilia that are on display in the second-floor hallway for all to see." Mrs. McCarthy is incredibly proud of the fifth-grade students and genuinely touched by their personal learning projects. She sends her gratitude to the military families of Hull students.

The 10-day weather forecast may show a rainy day on Wednesday, but that won't keep our 4th & 5th grade students from running the Jacobs School's **11th Annual Turkey Trot!** Parents and guardians of fourth and fifth graders are welcome to attend our schoolwide pep rally and watch their children run the race.
