During our November assembly we will be introducing a new program that teaches students 12 tools to help them manage interpersonal and intrapersonal conflicts. We will provide more information as we roll out the program, including parent workshops.

Not Every Hero Wears a Cape Plan & Practice Your Escape

In honor of Nation Fire Prevention Week, Captains Ahlquist and Johnson, and Firefighters Resnick and Gibbons of the Hull Fire Department led a 30 minute presentation for each homeroom in grades PreK-5 throughout the week. *Not every hero wears a cape. Plan and practice your escape* was the theme of this year's campaign, one that tied in nicely to our most recent Superpower themed assembly. In addition, the firefighters created PowerPoint presentations with useful visuals to target important skills at each grade level. The following training was provided to each grade level:

- **PreK Stop, Drop & Roll** Students practiced the maneuver on gymnastic mats as the firefighters assisted them.
- K Firefighters are community helpers During the presentation, Captains Ahlquist and Johnson discussed the role of firefighter within their community. Additionally, in an effort to alleviate any fears of a firefighters dressed in his or her gear, Firefighters Resnick and Gibbons demonstrated how each piece of equipment is put on before entering a burning building.
- Gr. 1 Crawl low under smoke Students learned about how smoke rises and practiced crawling on their hands and knees on the gymnastic mats.
- Gr. 2 Escape Plans Students were instructed to speak with their families to plan for two escape routes from their house as well as meeting places once outside. "Get out, and stay out."
- **Gr. 3 What is Fire** Students were introduced to the Fire Tetrahedron (heat, fuel, oxygen, chemical chain reaction).
- **Gr. 4 Reporting Emergencies** The Firefighters instructed students how to identify an emergency and how to report it.
- **Gr. 5 Cooking Safety** Safety precautions around cooking were discussed.

Each student left with a Fire Safety bag of goodies. Additionally, each student was given a poster board and asked to draw a picture that represents what they learned during Fire Prevention Week. Posters are due, Friday Oct 18th. The Hull Fire Department will pick one poster from each grade level that best represented Fire Safety Week and award the students a ride to school on the fire truck. Captain Ahlquist will announce the winners during our November assembly.
