COVID NOTES

- March 2020 to June 2020 – Employed full credit (100), credit (85), and no credit (59) into the grading system.
- Full year courses and semester courses for the 2019-2020 academic year were given a numeric grade as a final course grade. Traditional course credit (6.0 for FY courses 3.0 for semester courses) was granted. Semester 2 grades were not included into the GPA due to school closure.

GPA, CLASS RANK & GRADING SYSTEM

- GPA is updated annually for high school students. GPA weighting for honors classes is + 0.5 and for AP classes + 1.0 on a 0 - 4.0 scale. Full year courses are 6.0 credits. Class rank is reported exact.
- The Hull High School year is four quarters (2 semesters) weighted equally for the final grade. The minimum passing grade is 60.

HONOR SOCIETIES & HONOR ROLL

Our high school National Honor Society chapters induct eligible tenth through twelfth grade students. Students who meet the scholarship criteria of a 3.5 or better GPA and are then evaluated based on leadership, character and service.

HONORS, AP®, AND APPLIED EXPERIENCE

- Over 20 Honors courses available, requiring additional depth and breadth.
- 20 AP courses offered across all departments & online learning. Results for 22-23 included 13 AP Scholars, 8 Scholars with Honor, and 5 Scholars with Distinction. **Greater than 55% of our graduates take at least one AP class. 23% of our students earned AP Scholar Distinction - double nationwide avg.**
- Robust Applied Experience (Internship) program including placements with the Hull Fire Department, South Shore Collaborative, and the United States Coast Guard
- Online learning options include high school (college prep and honors) as well as college level AP courses through our approved third-party providers, Virtual High School & Edgenuity.

COMPREHENSIVE SCHOOL COUNSELING PROGRAM

Our school counseling program continually improves outcomes for all students in academic achievement, college planning, career readiness, and social personal development. Our school endorses the Massachusetts Association of School Counselors (MASCA – www.masca.org) model for Comprehensive School Counseling Programs. Our systemic advisory curriculum, grades 9-12 includes opportunities for ALL students to engage in important lessons, is preventative by design, and developmental by nature.

THE STUDENT LEADERSHIP AND SERVICE

Students develop citizenship, character, and leadership by coordinating activities involving student government, honor societies, and clubs. Student leaders organize and supervise events to enhance student life including dances, tutoring, clubs, trips, school spirit experiences, and student conferences. In high school, Student Leadership is divided into class councils for each grade. Members are elected from our councils to serve as class leaders.
