News from the Captain's Quarters:

To the Hull High School Community,

As Principal of HHS, I am compelled to write to you asking for your support. I am always proud of the effort, dedication and accomplishments of our Hull High School students, but as the weather gets warmer, I find myself in need of your assistance to ensure the safety, order and discipline within the school. As we near the end of the school year, there are two items that you may be able to help reinforce in regards to the expected proper student behavior.

First, "Spring Fever" seems to have enveloped the town of Hull as we experience more sun, longer days, and warmer weather, all of which can cause distraction issues with students. With the start of fourth quarter this week, I want to remind students, parents and guardians we need to capitalize on this increased energy to help keep grades on track for a strong academic finish to the school year. Many clinicians and educators offer suggestions on how to guide our students through this exciting time of year; here are four ways to do just that:

1. *Communicate with and support the teachers.* Reach out to teachers with an email. Keep this contact brief and positive even if they have less than positive news for you (including late or missing assignments). Acknowledge that you understand how difficult it must be to motivate a classroom full of youngsters this time of year and assure them that you are willing to do whatever you need to do to make their job easier.

2. Set academic goals with your child. This should include fourth quarter goals for finishing their year strongly. Keep it positive and focused on their needs. Goals should include homework, schoolwork, behavior and organization all the way up to the last day of school.

3. *Encourage, Encourage, Encourage*. We know how difficult it is to be positive when your child is doing less than their best in school. So remember to remain calm, listen to your child, be patient, provide positive options and remind them that they CAN do it!

4. "Pay the piper" when needed. As adults, we don't like failure and we certainly don't like to see our children fail when we can help them! Sometimes, however, failure is exactly what they need to LEARN! Allowing your child to bear the natural consequences of their decisions is a healthy way for them to learn from their mistakes. And there will be other opportunities for them to succeed!

Secondly, I ask for your support by remembering the boundaries of the HHS Dress and Appearance Procedure on page 30 in the Student Handbook. We are a school building, and HHS understands and is respectful of the fact that the fit of clothing is dependent on the body of the individual. The dress code is not enforced in a way that has a discriminatory impact on students based on race, sex, gender identity, gender expression, sexual orientation, ethnicity, religion, cultural observance, household income, or body type/size. HHS just wishes to keep distractions to a minimum.

Thank you, in advance, for your support. It has been an amazing year and we are all looking forward to its successful and enthusiastic completion. - Mr. Knybel
