PSAT Test Administration

HHS is offering the PSAT on Wednesday, Oct. 12th for All Grade 11 and Grade 10 students. The PSAT measures college readiness based on a student's reading, mathematics and writing skills. The test is used to identify a student's strength and weaknesses and create a targeted study plan in preparation for future college and career pathways. Test takers receive personalized test analysis and feedback with their scores. Students that take the PSAT score an average of 15% higher on their SAT. Comprehensive results are released in December.

- First Place and Runner-Up entries in both categories will be available on the MIAA website.


