Tips for Playing at Home

Take advantage of listening to your own sound without the Band. Spend a little time figuring out how to play a tricky note pattern or strengthening your tone. Hint: play in front of a mirror and focus on how you use your facial muscles along with your breathing. Remember to review what you already know AND work on something challenging. If you only have 10 minutes to play at home, make a plan to use it wisely.

Tips for Playing at School

Take advantage of listening to your teammates. A musician's ear is their first instrument and needs to be trained to hear right from wrong. If you hear a member of your section playing very well, then try to imitate them. The Band can only sound great if we all know how to create great sounds.

Informal Performances

Supplies

A musician needs to be prepared for anything. To keep your instrument running in top condition you need to be prepared for those sticky valves, chipped reeds or broken drum sticks. I **recommend** the following for:

Flutes: bottle of key oil, precision screwdriver set, old clean t-shirt

Clarinets and **Saxophones**: At least TWO reeds or a box of 10 (#2 ½ or 3), cleaning swab, bottle of key oil, mouthpiece brush, cork grease (clarinet), precision screwdriver set, old clean t-shirt

Trumpets, **French horn** and **Baritone horn**: bottle of valve oil, slide grease, mouthpiece brush, valve casing brush, cleaning snake, old clean t-shirt

Trombone: bottle of slide oil, slide grease, spray bottle, cleaning snake, old clean t-shirt

Percussion: TWO pairs of drum sticks (7A and 5A), drum key, practice pad
