Course Breakdown

The course will be taught through the lens of perspectives. All history has altering views of what/who was right and wrong. In this class we will look at differing views of; historical events, individuals, the idea of the hero, race in America, collective movements/beliefs, mythology, business rights v. workers rights, immigration, ideals and beliefs.

A quote from the New York Times article titled, *The Surprising Truth About How Humans Determine Right and Wrong* explains my approach to teaching, "There are few things we enjoy more than complicating — or upending — the most common, fundamental assumptions about how the world works. It's not that we want to upset you. Rather, those assumptions, though reasonable on their face, are often misleading, out of date, simplistic or just wrong. And, usually, we find that once you see how things really work, lots of seemingly intractable problems or unsolvable mysteries about the world become easier to figure out."
