Course Breakdown

I. Assessment - 40%

<u>Tests:</u> Tests will be given on a regular basis and they will always be announced.

<u>Quizzes:</u> Quizzes will be given with or without announcement. If information for a quiz is to be "memorized" I will warn you. Otherwise, it will be based on open notes and open homework.

II. Essays and Projects - 40%

At least once a semester there will be a project or essay assigned by Mr. Mullin. The projects will vary and there will be ample time to chose and prepare for a project.

III. Homework -10%

Homework is given nearly every day and it is due the next day. There will only be homework extensions if you are absent. **There is NO late homework**.

IV. Participation/Attendance - 10%

Participation includes; *arriving on time, assigned seat, prepared for class, taking notes,* and *participation*. Participation and attendance grades will be broken into two categories: attendance and classwork. Everyday credit will be given in both of these categories.

Super Important Information:

<u>Absences:</u> When absent, each student is responsible for finding out the work he or she missed. This means getting homework assignments, notes, handouts, etc. Lateness and unexcused absences will result in reduction from final grade.
