# The First Days of School – Construction Update

The first day of school is Wednesday, August 30th. <u>Students must arrive by **7:55 a.m.**</u> and be in homeroom/class by 8:00 a.m. Students arriving at school after 8:00 a.m. must report to the office for a tardy pass to class.

**Please Note:** Due to a recent inspection, the front entrance to the school will be closed for approximately <u>two months</u> while repairs are made to the façade that overhangs the entrance. <u>Bus</u> <u>students</u> will still be dropped off on Central Ave in the front of the building at the same location as previous years and will enter the school using the first side entrance on the L Street side of the building. <u>Parents that drive students</u> should turn down M street, drive around the back of the building, turn left on L Street and drop students off near the intersection of L Street and Central Avenue next to the school.

Dismissal for students that ride the bus is at 2:45 p.m. All other students are dismissed at 2:55 p.m. after the buses depart. Please do not pull up to the school early as students cannot be dismissed until the buses are parked in front of the school.

There is no school on Friday, September 1st, or Monday, September 4<sup>th</sup>.

#### **Tardy and Early Dismissal Procedures – Construction Update**

One of the most important skills a student can learn is regular, on-time attendance. Please help us to reduce disruptions to the classroom by ensuring that your student arrives on time and early dismissals are kept to a minimum. Students miss instruction and learning when they are tardy or dismissed early. <u>While the front entrance is closed, students that are tardy or dismissed early will need to use the back entrance</u>. There is a small parking lot behind the school that will be used for temporary visitor parking.

*For students that are tardy,* please use M Street to drive around to the back of the building. There is no need to park. Please drop your student off at the entrance to the parking lot and they can enter the building through the back door. Your student should ring the door bell and the front office will "buzz them in." Your student should report to the office to sign-in.

*For students that are dismissed early,* please use M Street to drive around to the back of the building and park in one of the 30 minute visitor parking spaces. Ring the door bell and the front office staff will "buzz you in." Parents/Guardians must report to the office to dismiss their child. Please remember to bring a current photo ID or we cannot dismiss your child.

A healthy breakfast and lunch is essential to a child's ability to do well in school. As the father of three, I know that kids are not always hungry when they first wake-up. At Memorial Middle School, students have the option of attending breakfast before school begins and eating in the cafeteria between 7:35 and 7:55 am. Our Enrichment and Intervention program will begin Monday, September 25<sup>th</sup> after 2nd period. Students may get their breakfast during this time. Students can also bring their breakfast to school and eat during the Enrichment and Intervention period. Since we started the school day breakfast program, students and teachers report that student focus has improved and behavior issues have decreased.

# School Council

School Council serves as an advisory board to the Principal. The Council consists of at least three parents, three teachers, a community member, and the Principal. Should we have more than three volunteers, elections for the position will be held at the Open House on September 15<sup>th</sup>. All students will receive their Chromebook after students and parents sign the handbook signature pages. The handbook can be found on the school website. The signature pages will be distributed to students on the first day of school. Students will receive the same Chromebook in the same condition that students returned in the fall. New students will be issued new or refurbished Chromebooks.



## Cell Phones

Technology continues to be a great resource to assist with learning and instruction. As all students are issued Chromebooks, students do not need cell phones in the classroom. Students will be able to store their cell phone in their locker during the school day. We understand that some students need to have their cell phone to help track and transmit medical information.
