# SPRING RECIPES- RAINBOW SLICE-AND-BAKE COOKIES

TOTAL TIME: 3HR      TIME ACTIVE: 1HR      MAKES      ABOUT 36 COOKIES

## INGREDIENTS

- ALL PURPOSE FLOUR - 2 ½ CUPS (PLUS MORE FOR DUSTING)
- BAKING POWDER- ½ TEASPOON
- SALT- ¼ TEASPOON
- UNSALTED BUTTER- 2 STICKS (ROOM TEMPERATURE)
- GRANULATED SUGAR- ¾ CUP
- CONFECTIONER'S SUGAR- ¾ CUP
- 2 LARGE EGG YOLKS
- VANILLA EXTRACT- 2 TEASPOONS
- FOOD COLORING- 1 TEASPOON EACH RED, ORANGE, YELLOW, GREEN, BLUE, PURPLE
- WHITE CANDY MELTS- 1 CUP



# SPRING RECIPES- RAINBOW SLICE-AND-BAKE COOKIES

TOTAL TIME: 3HR      TIME ACTIVE: 1HR      MAKES      ABOUT 36 COOKIES

1. WHISK THE FLOUR, BAKING POWDER, AND SALT IN A BOWL
2. BEAT THE BUTTER, GRANULATED SUGAR, AND CONFECTIONERS SUGAR IN A BOWL WITH A MIXER ON MEDIUM-HIGH SPEED UNTIL LIGHT AND FLUFFY
3. BEAT IN THE EGG YOLKS AND VANILLA UNTIL SMOOTH
4. GRADUALLY BEAT IN THE FLOUR MIX UNTIL THE DOUGH COMES TOGETHER
5. DIVIDE THE DOUGH INTO 6 PIECES AND DYE EACH ONE A DIFFERENT COLOR
6. ROLL THE DIFFERENT COLORED DOUGH INTO RECTANGLES ON A PIECE OF PARCHMENT PAPER (EXCEPT FOR THE PURPLE DOUGH. WRAP THAT INTO A CYLINDER)
7. WRAP THE BLUE DOUGH AROUND THE PURPLE, AND THE GREEN AROUND THE BLUE. CONTINUE WITH ALL OF THE COLORS.
8. WRAP THE RAINBOW LOG IN PLASTIC WRAP, AND FREEZE FOR ABOUT AN HOUR
9. PREHEAT THE OVEN TO 375°F
10. TRIM THE ENDS OFF OF THE DOUGH, AND CUT INTO SLICES ABOUT  $\frac{3}{8}$  INCHES THICK
11. ARRANGE ON A BAKING SHEET AND REFRIGERATE FOR ABOUT 15 MINUTES
12. BAKE FOR ABOUT 10 TO 15 MINUTES AND LET COOL
13. MICROWAVE THE CANDY MELTS IN A BOWL FOR ABOUT 30 SECONDS
14. PIPE THE CANDY MELTS ONTO THE ENDS OF THE COOKIES TO LOOK LIKE CLOUDS
15. ENJOY!



# The Interesting and International History of Ceiling Fans



Dating back to India in the 17th century, ceiling fans have been a beloved part of our daily lives. The first ceiling fans were made of palm fronds and were operated with a string pulled by slaves or servants. More advanced ceiling fans had only two blades powered by belts and rushing streams of water. These fans were more often used in restaurants or other establishments than in the ordinary home. In 1882, the first electrically powered fan was built by a man named Philip Diehl. It was powered by a motor originally used in sewing machines. Through the years Diehl improved the fan to what is similar to what we see today. He added a light to fit into the ceiling fan for added comfort.

By the 1920s ceiling fans were common in the US. They improved in that they had four blades instead of two. This made them quieter and able to circulate air faster. Then, with the rising popularity of the air conditioner ceiling fans were slowly pushed out of the picture. But in tropical countries like India, ceiling fans were all the rage. Manufacturers continued to improve the fans, making them more energy efficient, and cosmetically better. Hopefully the future of ceiling fans will continue to improve and they be a prized focal point for any room.
