
Advanced Placement (AP) Exams Overview

- AP Exam: Standards-based exams that are given throughout the world.
- In order to label a class "AP," the syllabus must be submitted and approved by The College Board.
- Some colleges waive classes for students who earn a 3 or higher on an AP exam.
- These are college-level courses.
- The highest possible score is 5.




Number of Students Taking AP Exams (2014–2018)



Percentage of Students Taking at least one AP Exam (2014 – 2018)




Number of AP Exams Taken (2014 – 2018)

- We continue to see a rise in the percentage of students earning a 3 or better.
- The waiver system has increased opportunities for students to take AP courses and has not led to lower AP test scores.

Scholastic Aptitude Test (SAT) Overview

- Nationally normed and standardized test
- Tests student's basic knowledge and skills in the areas of reading, mathematics and writing
- Evaluates how a student thinks, reasons and communicates
- SAT scores still an essential part of the admissions process.




Scholastic Aptitude Test (SAT) Overview


The new SAT was introduced March 2016

- Two sections
 - Evidence-based reading and writing
 - Math
- No longer a separate writing section
- Optional essay (more selective schools may require it)
- More relevant vocabulary
- No more penalty for guessing
- Back to 1600 (800 each section)
