When you drive by HHS, you will see the POW/MIA Flag displayed under our Nation's Stars and Stripes. The 101st Congress passed US Public Law 101-355, which recognized the POW/MIA flag and designated it "the symbol of our Nation's concern and commitment to resolving as fully as possible the fates of Americans still prisoner, missing and unaccounted for in Southeast Asia, thus ending the uncertainty for their families and the Nation". The importance of the POW/MIA flag lies in its continued visibility, a constant reminder of the plight of America's UNRETURNED VETERANS. Other than "Old Glory," the League's POW/MIA flag is the only flag ever to fly over the White House, displayed since 1982 in this place of honor on National POW/MIA Recognition Day. Friday, September 16, 2022 is National POW/MIA Recognition Day. We are raising the POW/MIA flag to honor two members of the Hull High School graduating class of 1960, which were MIA/POW during the Vietnam War.
