The Hull Public Schools, in partnership with our entire community, will nurture a culture of personal success, collaboration and support. We will develop well-rounded, enthusiastic learners and leaders who think critically and innovatively, while mastering the essential skills to advance in, and contribute positively to, our diverse and changing world.



Academics



- Free full-day kindergarten program is available to all students. Integrated preschool is available to students with special needs and to typically developing peers.

- 8 Advanced Placement courses currently offered.
- Through Virtual High School and Edgenuity, students have access to over 200 additional courses, including additional AP and foreign language courses.
- Hull High School is fully NEASC accredited.
- Music, art, technology, health and physical education programs are offered in grades K-12.
- Middle school and high school students meet weekly with a faculty adviser to monitor performance and foster a positive school culture.
- Middle school students have the opportunity to attend enrichment and intervention activities during the school day.
- High school students travel internationally to work with Habitat for Humanity and with the scientists in the Galapagos Islands.
- Student support local charities through community service.
- Hull High School graduates are accepted into many prestigious colleges and universities, including: Harvard, Bates, Boston College, Boston University, Brown, Fordham, RIT and MIT.

Technology

- All students in grades 6-8 issued an iPad and all students in grades 9-12 issued a Chromebook. The elementary school uses iPad and Chromebook carts shared between classrooms.
- Coding is taught to all students starting in Kindergarten.
- High-speed wireless internet access is available in all schools, as well as a state-of-the-art foreign language lab at the high school. Most classrooms are equipped with interactive whiteboards.
- Technology education programs in grades 6-12 focus on the Engineering Design Process, where students design and build projects.
- Television production courses are offered in a state-of-the-art facility, equipped with production and editing studios. The school district partners with Hull Community TV to produce programs on local cable television.
- Hull High School offers a fully operational workshop where students learn drafting and building skills.

Music, Theatre & Art

- All students in grades 6-12 have the opportunity to participate in band and chorus.
- The middle school and high school bands are keeping alive the long tradition of music excellence by performing at school and community events including parades, football games and dedications.
- Theatre programs available for students in grades 5-7 and for students in grades 8-12. Both programs participate in the State Drama Festival.
- Advanced art offerings include Three-dimensional Art, Computer Imaging and Portfolio Development.



Athletics

- The Athletic Department offers 17 varsity teams, 7 junior varsity teams and 2 freshman teams for high school girls and boys, including sailing and golf.
- South Shore League Championships: 2016: girls track, cheerleading, boys lacrosse. 2017: girls soccer, boys cross country.
- The high school fitness center is open year round and is available to all students.

Extended Services

- The Hull Family Network offers a variety of free activities for parents and their children, ages four and younger.
- Before-school and after-school care is available for students in grades K-5. After-school programs at all three schools are designed to assist students with academic performance and to provide enrichment opportunities.
- Adult Education course offerings are based on community interest.
